Current Research

I am currently working on three major research projects. First, I am completing work on my pragmatic theory of vagueness. I argue that vagueness unavoidably involves boundarylessness, but that revocable boundaries can be drawn in any given conversational context, thus giving us a simple way to dodge the sorites paradox in practice. Second, I am developing a way of doing metaphysics that avoids the inflexibility of strict realism, but that does not deny that there are metaphysical facts. The case I use to illustrate this is my new model of gender, meant to replace the common, but unhelpful models that currently dominate public and academic discourses about gender. Briefly, I think that words like 'male' and 'female' are highly indeterminate and purpose-dependent, so that no single (or simple) conceptual analysis can get them right. If we treat the metaphysics of gender as "modeling," we can capture its pragmatic aspect. Third, I am developing a general account of insults. My working definition is: to insult is to express a lack of due regard.
