Title Essays on Well-Being, Welfarism and Affective States

Description This PhD thesis addresses a series of topics related to well-being. I start with the problem of its measurability, which is addressed in chapters 1, 2 and 3. In chapter 4, I examine how conscious states can be quantitative, and how this bears on the thesis of Revelation, i.e. the idea that we are presented with the essence of our phenomenal properties. In chapter 5, I investigate the nature of affective states such as pleasure, which are often taken to be a component of well-being. Finally, in chapter 6, I introduce effective altruism, a movement which roughly seeks to find out the best opportunities to promote well-being, and critically discuss some objections that have been raised against it.
