Reporting to Vice President Human Resources and sponsored by President Iron Ore, I established a customer-oriented 'value chain' of HR services supporting 10 000 employees, incorporating labour planning, recruitment, training design and delivery, HR administration, and management of BHP's new Perth headquarters. Having designed and implemented the model and associated technologies at the height of the mining boom, its flexibility was proved as labour demand and supply profiles changed. With a budget of AUD126 million and a staff of 210, my Department became the industry leader in training, and exceptional in sourcing and mobilising people for operational, technical, and professional roles.

2006 - 2011 Head of Supply

Reporting to the Chief Financial Officer, I was responsible for the procurement of USD3.2 billion worth of goods and services annually (personal delegation of USD52 million), for purchasing and procurement governance and systems, and for logistics management of fuel, explosives and USD240 million of spares. My team of 130 (including eight senior manager-level direct reports) delivered contract sourcing, negotiation, implementation and management in fields as diverse as major capital procurement, energy trading, aviation, explosives, logistics, earth moving equipment, bulk commodities and maintenance services from both domestic and overseas sources. I also led Commercial Division implementation planning for the anticipated merger of BHP and Rio Tinto, which ultimately did not receive regulatory approval.

Director Logistics and Customer Service Australasia

Responsible to the Vice President Supply Chain for all logistics and customer service operations in support of Arnott's Biscuits, Arnott's Snackfoods and Campbell's Soup throughout Australia and New Zealand, a AUD1.5 billion enterprise and one of the largest FMCG supply chains in Australia. Managed an annual logistics budget of AUD115 million, and served on the Executive Leadership Team of Arnott's Biscuits Ltd. As such, I shared accountability for Arnott's overall strategies and financial performance. During my tenure, Campbell Arnott's undertook a supply chain transformation in support of retailer initiatives and a move to central warehouse operations. I headed the logistics, contract negotiation, and industrial relations aspects of this project, and served on the Steering Committee implementing SAP and other IT systems Company-wide.

Responsible to the Managing Director of Australia's largest privately owned pick-and-pack logistics company (since acquired by Australia Post) for operation of two multi-site Distribution Centres. The facilities produced up to 6 000 orders and 320 000 units per day for clients such as Chanel, Coleman camping supplies, McGraw Hill and Thomson publishers, Whirlpool, Suzanne Grae clothing and Columbia Tristar Home Entertainment. The high

volume, highly seasonal, rapid throughput facilities employed between 180 and 350 staff and a range of complex operational systems.
