Thesis title: Desires, Reasons and Moral Obligations

My thesis looks at the connection between desires and what's valuable, what reasons we have, and what we ought to do. Chapters 1 and 2 defend the idea that agents' reasons to act are necessarily linked to what they desire. Chapters 3 and 4 look at what we ought to do. The project looks to promote a better understanding of our mental states, our desires and our motivations and what this can tell us about our moral lives.

I am also interested in understanding mental health (particularly depression), and how it relates to action and motivation. This is a topic that's come up a lot in work for my thesis, and that I'm now pursuing independently.
