Summary of Current Research

In 'A Non-Truth-Conditional Semantics for Knowledge Attributions' I give a novel semantics for knowledge attributions. It is based on Chris Potts' work in linguistics, especially *The Logic of Conventional Implicatures*, and differs radically from current invariantist/contextualist/relativist models.

More generally, I am interested in indexicality, context-sensitivity, context-sensitive semantics and pragmatics and the notion of context. I am interested in how and why have contexts been, and continue to be, appealed to in semantics, and what implications this has for semantic analysis.
