*Remarks:* The UNIVERSITY WRITING COMMITTEE at the University of New Hampshire established and managed a university-wide programme titled 'Writing Across the Curriculum'. This programme required all undergraduates to complete four from an approved list of designated 'writing intensive' courses ('modules'), at both introductory and advanced levels, and both within and outside the student's major field of study. My own introductory courses were particularly suited to this programme, with only minor adjustment; they were used as models for faculty developing Writing Intensive course syllabi.

As SUBJECT COORDINATOR for Kent Philosophy's RESEARCH ASSESSMENT EXERCISE (2007–2008), in my first term in post I took a sheaf of records of colleagues' research-related activities and developed them into a clear, balanced and compelling portrait of Kent Philosophy's research. This involved developing a vision for the Philosophy Section of a balanced and integrated pluralistic programme. Our submission received a score of 5 out of a possible 5\*, by the previous standards which were still valid at the submissions due date. (Subsequent to their own submission deadline, the RAE programme changed its scale and its criteria (*sic!*); accordingly, our programme did not fare well numerically.)

As CHIEF EXAMINER for Philosophy at the University of Kent, Canterbury, for second- and third-year undergraduate exams and essays, I established (for the first time) clear and comprehensive procedures and guidelines for the many labour-intensive tasks involved in the internal monitoring of colleagues' assignments and marking of student work, and the preparation of the same for the External Examiner. These procedures led to the most concise and effective 'Final Exam

Board' meeting in Kent Philosophy's history: 2 hours instead of a whole day. My procedures and activities received very high praise, both internally from colleagues and from my Chair, and from the External Examiner.<sup>55</sup>
