Jan Slaby is Professor in Philosophy of Mind and Philosophy of Emotion at Freie Universität Berlin, Germany.

My work spans the area between the philosophy of mind, construed broadly, social philosophy and philosophy of human and mind sciences. A key aim of my research is to develop an integrative account of the social constitution of the human mind by combining enactivism, extended mind and embodied mind approaches with emphasis on emotion and affect. Another orientation is toward the affective dynamics of social interaction and toward a ‘political philosophy of mind’. As regards philosophy of science, I am interested in the nature and methodological role of concepts in both the humanities and natural science research, and I have developed a critical perspective on the explanatory range and methodological potential of human neuroscience. A more recent research interest is in interdisciplinary affect studies, and on bringing a discussion of philosophical methodology in conversation with recent work in cultural studies, including approaches from feminist, postcolonial and critical race theory.

With Suparna Choudhury (McGill University), I am an initiator of the *Critical Neuroscience initiative* that develops a multi-perspectival contextualization of the human neurosciences, responding critically to the claim of an alleged ‘neuro-revolution’ in the human sciences, the humanities and the academy at large.
