Computational and experimental cognitive scientist specializing in how people build and calibrate trust, both individually and in groups. My work focuses on epistemic vigilance ('who to believe?') and strategic vigilance ('with whom to collaborate?'). Combining experiments and agent-based modeling, I extend micro-level findings in cognitive science to explore collective behaviors, modeling societal resilience to misinformation.
