### MONOGRAPH IN PREPARATION

*Unruly Agency* [formerly *Enriching Practical Reason*]

Abstract: The focus of this monograph is what I dub "unruly" forms of agency. Much of what we associate with the concept of human agency is highly idealized. We focus on understanding what it is to reason and to deliberate well, to form intentions to act in light of the right kinds of reasons, and to develop dispositions and character traits that enrich our autonomy. But much of actual agency is relatively *unruly* in that it doesn't fit neatly into this picture. Unruly forms of agency include our capacity make commitments, to make judgements about meaningfulness and value in the context of the pursuit of personal projects, to aim at authenticity, to make decisions about what matters to us, to have aspirations, among others. I provide a descriptive theory of the ways in which these expressions of agency are 'unruly', with the aim of better understanding why, how and whether they enrich our agency and to what extent these aspects of agency are (or should be) rationally evaluable.
