

## Summary of Pedagogical and Scholarly Work

### Introduction:

This summary addresses my pedagogical and scholarly contributions along two integrated pathways. The first section presents key activities carried out before obtaining the University Qualification Certificate in a concise form, while the second section details accomplishments after obtaining the qualification, reflecting a progressive trajectory in research, teaching, and service to the university.

### I. Before Obtaining the University Qualification (2011–2020):

Between 2011 and 2020, my scholarly efforts focused on security issues and international politics, with particular attention to transformations in the Arab region and Africa.

#### A. Scholarly Work:

##### 1. Scientific Articles:

I have published several articles in national and international peer-reviewed journals addressing pivotal issues in international relations and security studies. At the international level, I explored the relationship between the military and political authority in Algeria in *Arab Policies Journal* (2016), analyzed the transitional justice experience in Sierra Leone in *African Readings Journal* (2016), examined Algeria's security approach in the African Sahel in *Arab Future Journal* (2017), and studied the independence of constitutional judiciary institutions in West Africa in *African Readings Journal* (2019).

At the national level, my work has addressed topics related to security and international politics, including the war on terror and securitization logic in the *Algerian Journal of Security and Development* (2011 and 2013), democratic citizenship in Arab countries in *Journal of Law, Society and Authority* (2016), and aspects of U.S. energy security in the African Sahel in *African Readings Journal* (2014). I have also tackled constitutional issues, such as the oversight of law constitutionality in Algeria in the *Constitutional Council Journal* (2017), and the independence of the constitutional judiciary in Asian contexts in *Annals of the University of Algiers*.

In addition, other articles have addressed power shifts in the Middle East after the Arab Spring, the national identity crisis in the Arab state, and the impact of securitization discourse on contemporary security studies.

##### 2. Participation in Scientific Conferences:

Throughout my academic career, I have contributed to numerous international and national scientific conferences. At the international level, I delivered a presentation at Hassiba Ben Bouali University – Chlef in 2018, addressing the challenges of state-building in Arab nation-states and the national identity crisis in the Middle East.

At the national level, I participated in several scholarly events, most notably a presentation on the impact of securitization discourse on the development of strategic studies after the events of September 11, examined from the Copenhagen School perspective, at the National School of Political Sciences in Algiers in 2018. Additionally, I presented on the role of the Constitutional Council in promoting the rule of law and safeguarding citizens' constitutional rights at Hassiba Ben Bouali University – Chlef in 2019. Earlier, in 2015, I delivered a presentation at the University of Oran 2 on the implications of legal insecurity on stability and social progress in Algeria.

### **3. Scientific and Professional Memberships:**

I held a research membership at the *Law, Society and Authority* laboratory at University of Oran 2 Mohamed Ben Ahmed from 2015 to 2021, contributing actively to the laboratory's fifth research team. In the field of scholarly publishing, I have served as the Editorial Secretary of *Law, Society and Authority* journal since 2015 and, since 2019, as a reviewer for the peer-reviewed journal *Legal and Political Sciences* (ranked "C"), published by University of El Oued.

Regarding scientific and organizational committees, I have regularly participated since 2015 in both national and international conferences and workshops, serving as a member of their scientific or organizing committees. Notable examples include: the National Conference on Citizenship and Constitutional Culture (2015), the International Conference on Institutions in Constitutional Judiciary (2016), the National Conference on Algeria and Emerging Security Challenges (2015), and the International Conference on Supreme Councils in Arab Parliaments (2016). I also contributed to committees for other conferences, including: Local Elections and Their Role in Consolidating Democracy (2018), Oversight of the Electoral Process (2018), Peaceful Democratic Transition in Algeria (2019), and the Legal Framework for Combating Corruption (2019).

Through this diversity of involvement, my memberships and contributions reflect a combination of research activity, editorial and peer-review responsibilities, and active engagement in the organization and evaluation of scientific events.

### **4. International Academic Training:**

In line with my commitment to engaging with the international academic community and developing my research expertise, I have participated in several specialized scholarly training programs.

In 2018, I joined the Constitutional Law Academic Program held in Tunisia from 26 November to 7 December, during its fourth session, which focused on "*The Role of Social Movements in Constitution-Making*", organized by the Arab Organization of Constitutional Law. This training offered a valuable opportunity to engage with Arab and international experts and discuss comparative approaches in constitutional law.

In 2019, I participated in the Summer Institute of the Arab Council for Social Sciences held in Broumana, Lebanon, from 23 to 28 June, during its third session on “*Critical Security Studies in the Arab Region*”. This program provided an important scholarly experience, allowing me to deepen my understanding of critical schools in security studies and engage in intellectual dialogues with researchers from various Arab countries.

### **B. Pedagogical Activity:**

In the field of teaching, I have been entrusted with responsibilities at the Master’s level, delivering specialized courses including: Theoretical Approaches in International Relations; New Trends in Security; Comparative Foreign Policy; International Integration; Foreign Policy Analysis; and Good Governance. At the Bachelor’s level, I have taught courses on Foreign Policy of Major Powers (third year), International Relations Theory (second year), and International Economic System (third year).

I have also contributed to university life by participating in the organization of doctoral competitions for the third cycle in Political Science at University of Oran 2 Mohamed Ben Ahmed during the 2016/2017 and 2017/2018 academic years.

In addition to teaching and academic activities, I have supervised several Master’s theses in International Relations and served as a member of committees evaluating numerous theses in the same field.

### **Conclusion:**

The scholarly and pedagogical achievements realized during the period 2011–2020 represent a cumulative and progressive trajectory that integrates teaching, research, and active engagement in academic mobility at both national and international levels. This body of work has contributed to consolidating expertise in higher education and scientific research, preparing for a more mature and enriched phase in the framework of university qualification, and offering broader opportunities for supervision and high-quality scholarly production.

## **II. After Obtaining the University Qualification (2020–2025):**

In addition to the achievements outlined previously, I have engaged in several scholarly and pedagogical activities summarized as follows:

### **1. Pedagogical Activities Conducted by the Candidate after Obtaining the University Qualification:**

#### **1.1. Teaching:**

##### **1.1.1. Lectures:**

At the lecture level, I delivered two core courses: *Theoretical Approaches in International Relations* (Master's Year 1 – International Relations) and *International Economic System* (Bachelor's Year 3 – International Relations, via distance learning).

### **1.1.2. Group Tutorials:**

Regarding supervised group tutorials, I supervised Master's and Bachelor's students in several core and specialized courses, including: *New Trends in Security, Comparative Foreign Policy, Diplomacy and International Cooperation*, and *International Relations Theory*. Additionally, I taught *Political Economy* for first-year Bachelor's students as part of the dual-degree program (semesters 1 and 2). This pedagogical pathway allowed me to diversify my academic experience across different levels and enhance interaction with students, facilitating continuous monitoring of their knowledge development and engagement with current developments in the field of international relations.

### **1.1.3. Online Teaching:**

Between 2020 and 2025, I delivered a series of online lectures via the distance learning platform. These primarily included the course *International Economic System* for third-year Bachelor's students in International Relations (2020–2024) and *Theoretical Approaches in International Relations* for first-year Master's students in the same program (2020–2025). I also prepared written lessons and conducted online sessions for group tutorials, including the course *Diplomacy and International Cooperation* for third-year Bachelor's students in International Relations and *International Relations Theory* for second-year students in the common political science track (2023–2025).

## **1.2. Pedagogical Activities:**

I have participated in a variety of pedagogical activities, including those related to doctoral competitions. I served as a member of the question design and grading committee for the third-cycle doctoral competition in the 2020/2021 academic year in the Political Science department at University of Abdelhamid Ben Badis – Mostaganem. I also carried out grading responsibilities for the same competition during the 2021/2022 academic year, and contributed to the supervision of doctoral examinations for the 2022/2023 academic year at University of Oran 2 Mohamed Ben Ahmed.

In the area of pedagogical committees, I chaired the deliberation committee for first-year Master's students in International Relations on 30 June 2021, reviewing the results of the 2020/2021 academic year. I also chaired the deliberation committee for second-year Master's students in the same program on 20 June 2022, to discuss the results of the 2021/2022 academic year. In addition, I contributed as a member of the subcommittee for student guidance and ranking in the Political Science department at the Faculty of Law and Political Science, University of Oran 2 Mohamed Ben Ahmed, during the 2021/2022 academic year.

I have contributed as a member of several doctoral thesis defense committees in Political Science at University of Oran 2 Mohamed Ben Ahmed, serving as a discussant for multiple dissertations covering a wide range of topics. These included alternative energies and the future of sustainable development in Africa (2023), the impact of irregular migration on societal security (2024), the effect of political liberalization on trade union pluralism in Algeria (2022), water security and its future risks for Maghreb countries (2022), and political transition and its impact on security in Tunisia after 2010 (2023).

Regarding Master's theses, my participation has varied between committee membership and chairing, contributing to the discussion of numerous theses in International Relations at University of Oran 2 Mohamed Ben Ahmed between 2020 and 2025. Topics addressed included Russian foreign policy toward the Maghreb after 2011, the implications of Brexit on British foreign policy, NATO's role in the Russia-Ukraine conflict, the effect of ethnic diversity on political stability in the Great Lakes region, and Algeria's strategy for achieving energy security and its implications for Euro-Maghreb relations.

Other theses explored pressing issues such as the refugee crisis and its impact on security and stability in the Maghreb, the crisis-prone nature of Algerian-Moroccan relations, the influence of rising BRICS powers on international security, challenges associated with reversing nuclear weapons bans, and the political and economic repercussions of the COVID-19 crisis. Additional topics included environmental security and sustainable development in North Africa, international competition over energy resources in the Caspian Sea, judicial mechanisms for enforcing international humanitarian law, and China's Belt and Road Initiative and its relation to Algerian foreign policy. Further issues addressed included geopolitics in East Africa, Algeria's diplomatic actions regarding regional affairs, and the role of the Human Rights Council as an international accountability mechanism.

Through these roles, whether as a committee member or chair, I have contributed to enriching academic discussion and enhancing the pedagogical and scholarly dimension of student evaluations.

### **1.2.1. Course Publications:**

I have prepared a course publication for the lecture *Theoretical Approaches in International Relations*, designed for first-year Master's students in the International Relations program. This publication is available on the D-SPACE platform of University of Oran 2 Mohamed Ben Ahmed.

### **1.2.2. Published Pedagogical Works:**

I have authored a pedagogical book titled *Theoretical Approaches in International Relations*, aimed at first-year Master's students in International Relations (Algeria: Elia Publishing and Distribution, 2024), ISBN: 978-9969-05-169-8.

### **1.2.3. Supervision of Doctoral Theses:**

In terms of academic supervision, I have overseen several doctoral theses in International Relations and International Security. I supervised the doctoral dissertation of student Bellil Mohamed entitled “*The Role of Diplomacy in Resolving African Conflicts after 2000*”, which was publicly defended at University of Oran 2 Mohamed Ben Ahmed on Wednesday, 1 March 2023. I also supervised the dissertation of student Saidi Yassine entitled “*Challenges of Societal Security in Algeria*”, publicly defended at the same university on Monday, 25 April 2022.

### **1.2.4. Supervision of Master’s Theses:**

Within the framework of academic supervision of Master’s theses in International Relations, I have guided a number of students whose works were publicly defended at University of Oran 2 Mohamed Ben Ahmed. These include:

- Shaimaa Modariss’s thesis on “*The Turkish-Greek Conflict over Cyprus amid International and Regional Tensions*”, defended on 19 June 2022.

In subsequent years, I supervised:

- Abdelkader Mohamed Al-Amin Flouh’s thesis entitled “*Algeria’s Energy Security in the Context of Regional and International Changes – Strategies and Challenges*”, defended on 19 September 2024.

## **2. Research Activities Conducted after Obtaining the University Qualification:**

### **2.1. Scholarly Output:**

#### **2.1.1. Scientific Publications:**

I have published several scholarly articles addressing political and security transformations in Algeria and beyond. Among these is a study entitled “*The Role of Civil Society in Consultations on Constitutional Amendments in Algeria*”, which highlighted the challenge of balancing civic engagement with the politicization of advocacy, published in *Journal of Law, Society and Authority* in 2021.

Another article, “*Steps to Resolve the Greek–Turkish Crisis amid Eastern Mediterranean Gas Discoveries*”, was published in the *Journal of Law and Political Science* at Abbas Laghr University in 2022, examining the energy conflict and its implications for regional stability.

In a different context, one study addressed the “*Securitization of the COVID-19 Pandemic*” through a securitization approach, published in *Sawt al-Qanun* at Khemis Miliana University in 2022, analyzing health crisis management dynamics as security issues.

Additionally, I published an English-language article entitled “*Enhancing Political Participation of Algerian Women: Challenges and Prospects*” in the *Journal of Law, Society and Authority* in 2024, focusing on the challenges and prospects associated with promoting political participation among Algerian women.

#### **2.1.2. International Presentations:**

I have participated in several international and national scientific conferences and seminars through presentations addressing pressing strategic and security issues. At the international level, I delivered a presentation entitled “*Gas Conflicts in the Eastern Mediterranean and the Role of the European Union in Mapping a Roadmap for Crisis Resolution*” at the international conference organized by the University of Boumerdès on 7 April 2021. I also presented “*Water Security and International Conflicts: Models and Causes*” at the international conference held at the University of Khenchela on 29 November 2021.

#### **2.1.3. National Presentations:**

At the national level, I contributed to several conferences and workshops through presentations examining issues of identity, security, and diplomacy. These included: “*Dimensions of the National Identity Crisis and Its Impact on State-Building in the Arab World*” at a conference at University of Oran 2 on 25 November 2021, and “*Challenges of Algerian Diplomacy in Resolving the Libyan Crisis*” at University of Batna 1 on 10 November 2022.

I also presented “*Securitizing COVID-19: The Logic of Securitization in Times of Crises*” at a national conference at University of Mascara on 20 October 2022, and “*Environmental Security and Climate Change*” at University of Batna 1 on 17 December 2022.

Furthermore, I delivered a presentation entitled “*Algeria and Democratic Transformations: Assessing Influencing Factors and Future Challenges*” at a scientific symposium at University of Oran 2 on 14 October 2023, and another entitled “*The Role of Legal Security in Attracting Foreign Investment*” at a study day organized by the Social Law Laboratory at University of Oran 2 on 3 April 2021.

Through these contributions, I have demonstrated a broad engagement with issues related to energy, security, identity, environment, and political transformations.

## **2.2. Scientific Activities:**

### **2.2.1. Participation in International Collaborative Projects:**

Within the framework of international research projects, I supervised a collective international publication entitled “*Security Implications and Challenges of the Digital Revolution in Africa*”, undertaken through the research unit *State and Society* in coordination with the Sub-Saharan Research Centre in London. This work was published by Al-Safwa Publishing – Egypt in 2024 (first edition), with an international registration number (ISBN: 978-1-7397192-9-6).

### **2.2.2. Published Scholarly Works in the Field:**

I published a scholarly book titled “*American Securitization of African Oil Imports: An Analysis from the Copenhagen School of Security Studies*” (Algeria: Elia Publishing and Distribution, 2024), ISBN: 978-9969-05-184-1.

### **2.2.4. Participation in Organizing Scientific Events:**

Within the framework of scientific conferences, I contributed to several national and international events. I served as a member of the organizing committee for the international conference on *The Jurisdiction of the International Criminal Court over the Occupied Palestinian Territories* in 2023. I also chaired and participated in organizing national conferences, including the PRFU project seminar on *Constitutional Democracy in Algeria* (2023), and I chaired the scientific committee for the national conference on *Double Standards in the West Regarding Wars* (2025).

Additionally, I contributed as a member of scientific committees for conferences addressing key issues such as Algerian diplomacy and security in Africa, Algerian economic diplomacy, knowledge economy and sustainable development, and political science in Algeria: reality and prospects. I also participated in the study day on *Management of Vital Resources and Energy Security*.

### **2.2.5. Participation in Scientific Activities (Experience, Memberships, etc.):**

My scientific activity has been anchored in my engagement with the *State and Society* research unit at University of Oran 2 Mohamed Ben Ahmed since 2021, where I have also chaired a specialized research team entitled *Security and Peace in Africa* since 2022.

In terms of academic publishing, I am a member of editorial and peer-review boards for several indexed academic journals, including *Journal of Law, Society and Authority*, where I have served as Assistant Editor (2021–2025) and Secretary of the Editorial Board since 2015. Additionally, I have been a reviewer for the *Journal of Legal and Political Sciences* since 2019 and for the *Algerian Journal of Human Security* since 2023.

To enhance the quality of the *Journal Law, Society and Authority*, I pursued professional development in academic publishing and journal management through specialized training via the Elsevier Research Academy platform. I attended the *Scopus Content Selection* webinar on 22 May 2024, successfully completed the *Publishing Open Access* course on 3 August 2024, and also completed the course *Ensuring the Quality of Scholarly Communication: It Takes a Village* on the same date. These certifications reflect my commitment to acquiring practical experience and international standards that contribute to raising the journal's quality and improving its prospects for inclusion in prestigious global databases.

I also participated in scientific committees for collective publications, both internationally and nationally. Internationally, I served on the scientific committee for the collective publication *Security Implications and Challenges of the Digital Revolution in Africa* (2024). Nationally, I contributed to the scientific committees for two collective publications on corruption in Algeria, published in 2021.

#### **2.2.6. Participation in Research Projects (PRFU, PNR, etc.):**

At the national level, I supervised and chaired a university training research project (PRFU) entitled *Constitutional Democracy in Algeria*, launched in 2021, officially approved under number 05/S.D.R.F.H.U/2021, code G02L01UN310320210001, and conducted during the period 2021–2024.

#### **Conclusion:**

The cumulative pedagogical and scientific activities demonstrate that my academic career has been based on combining teaching, supervision, and training responsibilities with active engagement in scientific research through authorship, publication, and participation in national and international conferences and workshops. This trajectory has been strengthened through teamwork within research units, contributions to editorial and peer-review boards for peer-reviewed journals, and involvement in research projects with both national and international dimensions. These efforts reflect a sustained commitment to developing knowledge in the fields of international relations, security, and diplomacy, and to consolidating the role of Algerian universities in producing high-quality scholarly knowledge with both academic and societal impact.
