	<i>Advisor</i>	Prof. Dr. Zulfiqar Ali I consider the relationship between a woman's identity and her freedom. The constructionist school of thought contends that a woman's identity as a woman is socially constructed, whereas the essentialist school of thought contends that a woman's identity is based on her essential property, the property necessary for a woman to be a woman. In this work, I have focused on the essential property of a woman's identity, primarily her material existence. Constructionists make perfect sense when choosing to wear a dress or pantsuit, keeping one's hair short or long, arguing that these attributes of a woman's identity are socially constructed. However, the problem starts when a woman in question is a transwoman or a woman in question chooses to forego her ovaries or abort the child? I propose that the best approach to overcome the disagreement between constructionists and essentialists is to adopt Simone De Beauvoir's phenomenological stance. A woman's identity does not exist in isolation from her surroundings, nor does her environment exist in isolation from her body. They both interact at different tangents of essentialist and constructionist assertions, and a woman should have the right to determine how that interaction occurs based on her own lived experience.
